January 22, 2012. Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Jon 3, 1-5, 10.

The theme of this passage is God's call and our response to be the kind of person the Maker has designed us to be. It is the call to repentance. This reading introduces Jesus' call for repentance in today's Gospel: Reform your lives!

Second Reading: 1 Cor 7, 29-31.

We should heed Paul's timeless advice that all human values, possessions, and even marriage are relative to the ultimate values of the hereafter. Married people are necessarily involved in the cares of this world, but they should be careful not to attach their hearts to it.

Gospel: Mk 1, 14-20.

Like the author of Jonah, Mark also deals with two calls. He first sets forth the call for repentance to all of us: "Reform your lives and believe in the good news." Secondly, Mark relates, another call of the disciples.

### QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION

"Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed."

- How do you make use of the extraordinary power of repentance in your life?
   I tell you, brothers and sisters, the time is running out.
  - What are the three most important things you have done with your life so far?
  - What may be left to do?

So they left their father Zebedee in the boat... and followed Jesus.

- When have you heard a direct invitation to follow Jesus?
- What did you do with it?
- How many ways have you been loved today? How many ways have you shown your love today?
- "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."
- When have you been willing to risk something in order to get something worth having?
